8. Circumstances and reasons for variations if any :

There are some variations in the expected outcome and actual outcome as mentioned above. In most cases, actual outcome is better than expected outcome. The main reason for variation (less outcome) is due to remoteness, frequent bandh, strike/blocked and poor means of transportation. The support of the communities is highly appreciable.

8. Problems encountered and strategy / ways incorporated to solve them:

Traveling and transportation was the major problem faced during this reporting period. Going to villages on foot continuously as per the program was difficult as we have to travel around 20-30 km. Therefore, our staff conducted 2-3 activities staying longer at particular village.

9. Key incidence (changes in the context of development impact):

During the months from July 2010 to July 2011 many very important events of great significance had taken place in our PEARL project Nungba. I would like to mention some of them that had affected and brought about great change in the life of the people of Nungba area in particular and Tamenglong District in general. The year 2009 was a year badly hit by natural disaster so much so the state government of Manipur declared 2009 as one of the drought hit states of India and many farmers could not cultivate their fields. The year 2010 was a blessing year for our country due to arrival of early rain and monsoon on time and a good promising agricultures year. But a small state like Manipur was badly affected by man-made disaster disrupting normal life of the people due to ADC election, no entry of Muivah to Manipur, 68 days economic blockade, general strikes, bandhs, bad condition of NH.37 (previously called NH. 53) due to heavy rainfall and so on which caused huge loses and long hardship to the common people. These long economic blockade and NH.37 bad condition lead to shortage of food in Nungba area. In order to safe their life from hunger they ferry rice from Nagaland through Buning katcha road. It affected so much in the implementation of project activities in the previous year 2010. But on the other hand, 2010 events like 68 days economic blockade and bad condition of NH.37 gives change in the implementation of project activities of this year (2011). The following are the few points of outcomes during the reporting period.

9.1. Right to Food:

- Community members are more aware about the various schemes and provision of Govt. under Right to Food. Hence, they could analyze and identify where things are gone wrong and where to initiate some concrete steps in order to ensure proper functioning of the schemes. The Nungba area Village Authority formed committee on Food Security; where the committee will work on PDS and other related issues to bring about food security in the area. Based on the information

and data gathered with the help of our team members, targeted individual village also initiate their own course of actions on PDS. The economic blocked has also contributed some positive impact on Right to Food. During those days of food scarcity due to blocked, people felt reality and the need of immediate attention on PDS and developing policies of food security at local level. Many of them realize the purpose of PEARL project better and the reason why our staff are being working with them so seriously. Therefore, we received prompt response and serious attention of the communities particularly on PDS. The year 2010 events give change the mindset of the farming community. **“We now realized that unless PDS items were store in the Nungba area we would not able to feed our children” say Dimthaurei Gangmei village authority secretary, Nungba.** The people of our project villages are now willing to support us and joined in the move to reduce PDS corruption.

- With the collaboration of Nungba area village authority association, Zeliangrong student union Nungba area, Nungba area women welfare organization, Targeted public distribution system forum Nungba area, Nungba women society and SHGs organized **public rally on PDS, ICDS and Mid-day meal** on 25th February 2011. More than 1500 people joined in the rally. The rally’s submitted memorandum to the Sub-Divisional Officer, Nungba. Play cards like stop PDS corruption, ensure right to food, denial PDS is denial of right to live, open fair shop at designated location, love the poor ensure their rights were the important event in the rally. The 6 persons from media team i.e. **Sangai express, Poknapham, Huyen lanpao, free press, ISTV and The cham** were present in the rally. Aftermath of the rally, PDS agents brought their entitlements at Nungba Headquarter 3 to 4 times which is compared to be better than the earlier period.

9.2. Right to work:

- After various trainings and meetings with the target villages on MGNREGS, they came to know better about the scheme. All 13 villages develop micro planning and based on that two of the villages submit their project for second of MGNREGS; while other villages are under process unlike previous years where Govt. official gave them readymade programs for the MGNREGS. They started getting information through RTI regarding NREGS. People are more curious about the scheme and its implementation process after the intervention.

9.3. Right to Credit:

- Now we are able to formed **16 farmers club** in the 13 villages. 11 farmers club were opened their saving account in the Bank. 2 farmers club (Sustainable livelihood development Farmers club Ruangdai and Jianiamnei farmers club) were started giving internal loan. To collaborate with NABARD Imphal, we submit 5 farmers’ proposal in the month of April.

- With the plan for the family to meet any unforeseen eventualities in life, our staff animated the BPL families to ensure **Janasree Bima Yojana policy of Life Insurance Cooperation (LIC) of India**. In March 2011 we could **insure only 50 members**. We approach to the LIC Silchar Branch Manager to give scholarship Rs.1200 annually for every member children studying from class IX to XII.

9.4. Right over natural resources management

- Communities are more aware about Govt. policies and Act on NRM. People started initiate activities on judicious use of natural resources. Some of the target villages resolved in their annual meeting not to hunt animals (wild) round the year but at particular season (September to December) and conservation of patch of land in water catchment area. 2 villages have already developed policies on NRM at their village level.

9.5. Advocacy and networking:

- In the previous year's few people were participated in any activities when we carried out. But this year people participation in the meetings, trainings, workshops was out of our expected target. With large support from the public, we are able to build up our rapport with govt. officers. In the month of April we conducted consultation on Terminus market at Nungba community hall and grace **Deputy Commissioner Tamenglong and Sub-Divisional Officer Nungba** as chief guest and guest of honour respectively. The DC expressed his willingness to support our cause. After analyzing the issue, we formed Organization called "Social Entrepreneurship Association Tamenglong" (SEAT).

- Networking with other Civil Societies have been initiated. Like the Block level Village Authority Association, Zeliangrong Student union, Nungba Area Women Union, Zeliangrong Women Union, Rongmei Naga Baptist Association and Tamenglong NGO Forum besides PEARL's partners. We have been doing sensitization workshops, meetings and consultation with them on PDS in particular. They are now members of the Committee on PDS and Concrete action plans have been developed to carry out in the second year. We believe in broad-based organization particular for Advocacy and Lobby activities.

9.6. Organization:

Capacity of staff improves tremendously in various aspects. Our team is more informed about the rights of the people and the policies of the Govt. Improve in building rapport with the communities. Also helps in overall improvement of the organization development process particularly financial management & accounting, reporting and documentation.

9.7. Key significance

Formation of civil society organization through PESCH PEARL project is as follow:

- Formed village level committee (VLC) in the 13 PEARL project villages.
- Formed Food and Livelihood committee Tamenglong (FLC-TML)
- Formed Nungba Area TPDS forum
- Formed 5 SHGs groups in the 5 villages
- Formed Nungba Area Village Authority Association (NAVAA)
- Formed Social Entrepreneurship Association Tamenglong (SEAT)
- Formed 16 Farmers clubs in the 13 project villages

10. Learning (Best practices / Case Studies):

Case Studies:

1. A Success story of Farmers club formation

I am happy to have an opportunity to express my humble gratitude to the Misericors, to all the IGSSS Officials and Director PESCH. Our Self Help Groups or Farmers clubs of Nungba area know you as their friends and true social worker.

Background

As a PEARL Project activity, we started awareness, training and capacity building programmes to form farmers club since from the inception of the project. But we could not form due to slow change of mindset of the farming community.

We conducted “Leaky Bucket” Analysis that is a tool for local economy Analysis in 21 February this year (2011). This is to understand the inflows and outflows of local economy from a community perspective. The main sources of income identified during the exercise were from cultivation and forest products whereas the main “leakages” (or cause of expenditures and cost to the communities) were education, essential commodities and health. After this activity, we are able to bring under one forum per village. Now they have a platform to safe guard their rights, voice their opinion, successfully established through people’s institution in the commodity. They are able to plan and mobilize local resources which were not the case previously.

Objectives

1. To develop and promote capacity building and human resource potential to utilize the natural resources for the poverty alleviation and healthy living.
2. To develop and promote farmers organizations in 13 villages with demonstration activities, savings, micro-credit, processing, local marketing and ownership responsibilities.

Achievement

The PEARL project significant outcomes were capacity building, mobilization and formation of 16 farmers club in 13 villages. The farmers club comprises of 600 families in 12 villages of Nungba sub-division and 1 village in Tousem sub-division. Out of these members 70% are female and 30% are male members. There are approximately 30 farmers capacitate in account keeping, book keeping and management through skill enhancement training, workshop, focus group discussion and planning etc. 11 farmers clubs were opened savings account at bank in their group name. The staff has managed to build a good relationship with village authorities, the government offices, Bank and likeminded NGOs which is the strength of the farmers club.

The farmers club have collaborated with local banks, NABARD and govt. agencies for linkages. In the month of April this year (2011) we have submitted five farmers club proposal to the NABARD Imphal for linkage. With the plan for the family to meet any unforeseen eventualities in life, our staff animated the farmers clubs to ensure Janasree Bima Yojana policy of Life Insurance Cooperation (LIC) of India.

Challenge

Some of the major challenges that we faced are slow change of mindset of the farming-community, poor transportation and communication.

2. Life Insurance policy for BPL families

With a vision for women empowerment our staff started awareness programme on skill enhancement and income generating for Self Help Group (SHGs) and Farmers in the year 2009. As we implemented the programs, we felt the need to ensure our rural poor farmers. I initiated the talk for insuring our partners with LIC branch Imphal but such schemes were not available in Imphal. I never give up my hope and kept on contacting many agencies like Diocesan Social Service Society (DSSS) Imphal. At last I found out that such scheme for insuring Self Help groups were available at LIC Silchar branch. Thus, I contacted the LIC Branch Manager. In the month of November 2010, with the approval by Director I along with Tr. Asui EED project staff met LIC Branch manager regarding the Jansree Bima Yojana policy for insuring our BPL families and brought Janasree Bima Yojana policy form. Then, the task for our staffs was to make SHGs member and farmers club aware of Life Insurance. Most of SHGs and farmers clubs members were ignorant about life insurance but, the staff kept on animating them about the benefit of joining this policy. In March 2011 we could insure only 50 members. We approach to the LIC Silchar Branch Manager to give scholarship Rs.1200 annually for every member children studying from class IX to XII.

3. Hunting period (Aug-Dec):

One project village, namely Bwanruangh takes up an issue to protect and preserved wild life at their village annual general meeting and take a bold initiative decision. They all agreed and resolved not to hunt wild animals/ birds during the months of Jan – July and allow hunting during the months of August –December every year. Because, it is considered that these period is a mating season for the wild animals. If human being give time and space and not disturb these period they (animals) will reproduce their offspring and increase their number. These will also be able to foster many rare species from the verge of extinction as well. This village takes up this policy into action since last year. This policy, to protect and preserved wild life is the first of its kind in our district and also in the whole state of Manipur. Therefore, this noble and innovative policy is to be acknowledged and emulate by the government.

4. Public Rally:

After strenuous effort for one and half year we could able to carried out public rally on PDS at the Sub-divisional level in collaboration with the civil societies of Nungba area. On the said rally, around 2000 people join the rally. The rallies carry placards inscribed as “Stop corruption on PDS”, “Save our right”, “Punish the guilty” etc. They submitted a memorandum demanding/ mentioning various points in it to the concern authorities through SDO, Nungba for necessary action. Accordingly the D.C, Tamenglong give a strong instruction to the subordinate office to find out the irregularities. Now it is visible that rice were brought and sold more regularly by the rationing agents.

5. Disunity and misappropriation of MGNREGS in PEARL Project villages

MGNREGS have been passed by the Government of India as Act for the development of the rural area by holding job-cards. But in Tamenglong District in general and Nungba area in particular, it has created disunity in the village.

As there is lack of proper bank account of the job-cards holders, the wage was released in the bank account of the village authority chairman. The village authority that were the implementing agency took the wages and materials components amount and distributed only the actual working wage for the job-cards. They make additional job-cards and extra working days by saying that it is for the expenditure incurred by them and for the other village fund. By doing so, they could now able to build their own house, buy vehicle and buy land at town. In such situation, there is a conflict over chairman seat. For instance, there are two chairmen in Nungba village. Due to corruption charge on MGNREGS, village authority secretary G. Dimthaurei was terminated from his post but gazette chairman support him and the other oppose him which led to disunity in the village. There also two self styles chairman each in puiluan, Siguilong and Muktikhullen villages respectively.

District Programme Coordinator released Rs.3109932 as 14 day's wage for 1763 job-card holders through BDO nungba. The BDO after deducting Rs. 13994 at the rate of Rs.9 from each of the job-card holders deposited to the 3 villages authority chairman account. However, on being investigated by our staff it was found that the said 14 days wage was not distributed to the job-card holders and many among the 1763 job-card holders were not working at all. Moreover, many job-cards did not have the official number nor signature of the relevant officials.

Further, some people holding genuine job cards never came out for work though they regularly took wages like others. While investigating job-card holders were given 10 days wage though they worked for only 7 days in puiluan village.

Likewise, 10 days wage was given to job-card holders of siguilong village and Okoklong village when they actually worked for only six and three days respectively.

When I met MGNREGS Project officer at his office (DC office Tamenglong) in regard MGNREGS social audit report checking, he said that social audit and RTI is not applicable for the state of Manipur particularly for Tamengong District. During the talked he directly contacts UG in mobile and gave to me. In such situation, real social audit will be long way if likeminded NGOs, civil societies and people are united and stand together in fight against the corruption.

There is village monitoring committee (VMC) in every village, in which church pastor is appointed as the head of the committee. But when we investigated, most of the pastor has no knowledge about neither himself as the head of the VMC, nor he sign in the VMC audit report.

The project allows mobilizing assets of the people by themselves with small support mainly the capacity building of the community; I think which is contributing towards sustainable development of the community. The support given by IGSSS staffs both at the program and organization level is remarkable.
